### Catherine Cookson Charitable Trust

The Catherine Cookson Trust supports a wide range of activities including education and training, environment and conservation, arts and culture as well as general charitable purposes. In particular, the Trust supports work with young or disadvantaged people.

Grants awarded are between £250 and £100,000 with the majority of grants £1,000 or less. There is no standard application form but written applications, enclosing a stamped addressed envelope should be sent to the address below. There is no set format or time limit for applications. The Trust does not publish any guidelines or application forms, so each application is considered individually. ### The Church and Community Fund

The CCF gives grants to community projects run by parish churches, deaneries, dioceses and other bodies connected to or working in partnership with the Church of England.

Typical projects supported by the CCF might include employing a youth worker, renovating an old church hall for use as a community centre or providing hot meals for the homeless in a church room. The CCF awards over £500,000 in grants every year with the majority of grants between £2000 and £5,000. All CCF grants seek to take the church out into the community, bring the community into the church and strengthen the relationship between the two.

### UnLtd Sport Relief Awards (UK)

UnLtd, the charity that supports Social Entrepreneurs, is accepting applications under its Sport Relief Grants Programme. There are three funding streams that young people can apply for. These are:

- ⇒ "Try it" which provides grants of up to £1,000 for young people to try out their idea
- ⇒ "Shape it" which provides grants of up to £5,000 to develop ideas
- ⇒ "Do it" which provides grants of up to £10,000 to grow projects.

## Awards for All

Awards for All are calling for more applications from the North East region. Generally, the quality of the applications made to the fund has been poor and groups are encouraged to seek support to complete applications to a high standard.

Groups and organisations in the 'Sedgefield Borough' area should contact CAVOS for support to submit Awards for All applications.

## Youth Opportunities Fund

The Fund is for young people's groups. Applications must be young person led but will require a supporting organisation. Maximum grants of £4,000 are available.

Your application might include trips, visits, residentials, equipment for your project and outdoor activities. They must link to at least one of the following Every Child Matters Outcomes, Being Healthy, Staying Safe, Enjoying and Achieving, Making a positive contribution, Achieving economic wellbeing.

Adults will be able to help with developing plans and completing the application form. If you do not have anyone to help you then the Youth Service will provide assistance

Please note that all grant money given to projects has to be spent by 31 January 2010.

## Non-Turf Pitch Grants

The Lord's Taverners has announced that funding is available for the installation of non-turf pitches, practice ends and nets.

Applicants can be England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) affiliated clubs, individual schools or other organisations directly involved in the development of youth cricket but must be approved by the Cricket Development Manager at your local County Cricket Board

Awards do not normally exceed the following levels:

- ⇒ Non-turf match pitch (£3,000)
- ⇒ Non-turf practice ends (£2,000)
- ⇒ Outdoor nets (£1,000).

## Arts Development Small Grants Scheme

Durham County Council has launched a new small grants scheme for community groups, creative professionals and arts organisations who are based in the county. Social enterprises and parish or town councils are also welcome to apply.

A maximum grant of £500 will be available for arts-based projects which respond to the priorities in the council plan and our priorities for arts development, which are:

- ⇒ more people getting involved in arts activities
- ⇒ aspirations to achieve high artistic and creative quality
- ⇒ strengthening existing partnerships or building new ones
- ⇒ arts development - working across new art forms, learning new skills, reaching new audiences

Projects must benefit the people living in County Durham.

Applying to the Arts Development Small Grants Scheme is just one way in which local groups and organisations can get involved in Durham's bid to be the first UK City of Culture. The county council is committed to supporting arts activities at a very local level, and we see the grants scheme as a great way for the voluntary and community sector to become part of this exciting opportunity.

The new countywide scheme is being piloted for 2009/10 has grown from successful grant schemes operated by the former district councils.

The Arts Development Small Grant scheme is competitive and funds are limited. Projects will be scored objectively according to how well they meet our priorities for arts development and the council's priorities. There are two deadlines for the 2009/10 round of the scheme: 12 noon on 30 October and 12 noon on 15 March.
